Summary of Analysis

From the Secondary School perspective, this is a very positive set of feedback overall. The main challenge is to reduce screen time and workload without compromising the overall structure of the working week or monitoring of attendance.

Analysis of feedback - Secondary

- 1. Overall: Positive feedback regarding Distance Learning. We need to refine our practices.
- 2. Student health: Most students are coping well, though teachers and parents need to continue to monitor this.
- 3. Most students enjoy the learning activities provided, but comment that they are too heavily screen-based.
- 4. Most students are maintaining other activities to balance work.
- 5. Most students understand what is required of them.
- 6. Most students are able to work independently.
- 7. There is balance in the types of activities set, but still heavily screen-based.
- 8. Most students are happy with the feedback they are receiving.
- 9. Most students and parents feel well supported. Learning Support is a development area.
- 10. The structure of applying the school timetable received positive feedback.
- 11. Most stakeholders affirm lesson by lesson attendance.
- 12. Distance Learning has led to an increased workload during the school day.
- 13. All constituents agree that screen time is much increased, and generally too high. The vast majority of student comments were concerned with too much screen time.

Action Points - Secondary School

Theme arising from Surveys	Action Points for current Distance Learning model			
Timetable Structure	No major change - but increased breaks between some lessons.			
Attendance	Attendance taking continues as usual; please continue to submit excusals through ManageBac.			
Screen time	Increase off-screen activities and dedicated off-screen times.			
Student Workload	Reduce where possible to reflect added challenge of distance learning. Consider Learning Support and ELA students in particular.			
Assessment	Proceed with assessments as normal in most cases. Some departments may require additional adaptations			
Homework	Should not be set unless absolutely necessary.			
Reports	As normal. Tailoring of Approaches to Learning skills to reflect the distance learning environment.			
Differentiation: Students needing support	Reach out to Learning Support students each week to check if they are managing the work set.			

Is Distance Learning Working?

- From the chart above the large areas of blue would indicate that it is.
- Assessments are going ahead as planned
- We will definitely be able to assess the Approaches to Learning and knowledge aspects of our programmes
- Students will continue to be asked to work with integrity we will continue to assume good intent.
- PYP exhibition yesterday was a great example of adjusting to meet the current needs
- Distance learning amplifies the needs of students who have English language acquisition (ELA) or learning support needs. We will work to try and provide more support after the break.

It is hard for families, particularly families of young children, as the support needed from parents creates an extra burden.

Primary School - Reports/Assessment

- Continue assessing and reporting on Approaches to Learning and the Learner Profile in a narrative comment
- Continue to indicate achievement (Beginning/Developing/Consolidating/Established) for Maths, Language, Uol
- Continue to indicate Levels of achievement for German and ELA
- Provide Engagement/Participation indicator for Art, Music and PE

Assessment

Assessment practices will continue as normal wherever possible. Some assessment tasks will be adapted to reflect the conditions of distance learning.

Reports

Report writing will go ahead as normal. Students and parents can expect End of Year reports this year as in previous years. ATL will be tailored to reflect distance learning.

IB DP Results and related questions

- IB has cancelled the May examinations.
- A grade will be determined based on the data that the IB has about each student (coursework, predicted grades and historical data). IB have collected this information in FAQs on their website (www.ibo.org).
- Students will receive a numerical grade (score out of 45) as usual.
- Grades will be awarded on 6th July as usual despite request for earlier awarding.
- Students will be supported, as they are every year, by VIS staff after the results are published.
- University advisors are working closely with the universities in an unprecedented period of uncertainty.
- Our hope is that we will be able to run Grade 11 examinations in June, if not, we will have to review alternatives.
- The Grade 10 DP choice process has been extended to the end of May.

What decision has been made about the Spring break?


I have made the decision to re-convene school on **Tuesday 14th April** and finish the school year on **19th June**. The total number of school days remains

This decision is based on:

- the results of the survey,
- the fact that schools will remain closed until at least the end of April
- The fact that students will be best served by having structure in their days when they are forced to remain in isolation
- The evidence from Asia that re-engaging young people with Distance Learning after a long break is hard for them.

Scenario B: If the Austrian government decides that businesses and schools must remain closed beyond 13th April - the most likely expectation, meaning that all families have a second holiday week in lockdown.
